

From the Minister – by Rev. Colin Fairweather

Football Prayers



The day after the Lionesses' victory, I wrote some special intercessions for morning prayer – something which I don't normally do.

Lord, we thank you for this new day, and this new week. And we thank you for the amazing sense of joy there is all across this land this morning, as we come to terms with the Lionesses' amazing victory last night in the football.

Lord, it's only football, and yet it does touch on something deep. Being an England football fan, generally speaking has been a miserable experience, full of disappointment and hurt. And we've all become programmed to think that managing our disappointment so that we still remain hopeful, despite all the evidence of our experience, is the only kind of triumph that's available to us. Thank you that there now a new script – where hope is no longer a masochistic duty, but something real and life-giving.

Lord, it's only football, and yet our victory last night is also gospel-rich. In Psalm 4, David says, 'How long, O men, will you cling to delusions and seek after what is false?' And the lionesses have demonstrated to us that we don't have to be content with deluded hope,

and we don't have to deal, time and time again, with the failure of that hope.

There are much broader lessons here for our attitudes to life – deliver us from the miserable resignation which has been our lot – deliver us from our hard-wired sense of inadequacy, and help us to sing a new song – not *Three Lions On My Chest*, which is actually a really melancholy song, and symptomatic of the whole unhealthy mindset.

Thank you for what seems like a new dawn, and a new script – for female football. In fact, I hope we don't call it female football, we just call it football, because that's what it is. Thank you for fresh possibilities. See I am doing a new thing – do you not perceive it?

The victory last night wasn't a divine victory, and it's poor theology to think that you were somehow on our side against Germany. Nonetheless, I see it as a kind of parable – that you offer us liberation from our self-made prison of failure and futility, and that you offer us an alternative narrative which is joyful – ecstatically joyful.

Of course, Lord, the real victory, the ultimate victory, is not England's victory in a football game against Germany, but Christ's victory over sin and death. But after last night, I wake up this morning rejoicing in Christ's victory all the more, and seeing the signs of it in how our hearts have all been lifted. Thine be the glory, risen conquering – endless is the victory, thou over death hast one. We bless you and we praise you, in your precious name. Amen.



The Connect 120 Fund – enabling community projects in the Stansted area

Connect 120 started as a collaborative venture between Stansted Airport and the churches along the A120 corridor. The purpose was to enable churches to facilitate mission in the local area, with a particular focus on schools and young people.

After lockdown, Connect 120 is now back in a new incarnation. The Connect 120 Fund has been set up by the churches of Stansted, Birchanger, Farnham, Takeley and Little Canfield, working together with priest-in-charge Rev Colin Fairweather.

The Fund seeks to support community-based projects, which may be social, educational, creative or environmental in nature – basically, anything that blesses our villages!

Applications will be considered by a discernment group, which will ask three fundamental questions of any proposed project:

- How is it consistent with Christian values?

- How will it promote personal, social, emotional, spiritual or intellectual flourishing?
- What legacy will it have?

The 'Christian values' criterion has a broad remit, and does not mean that projects have to be explicitly faith-based. Justice, compassion, creativity, healing and well-being are all Christian values, as is the desire simply to make community life better.

The core purpose of Connect 120 fund is to allocate funds wisely in order to bless our communities. So if you are involved in community life and have ideas about how to enrich it, we would love to hear from you.

The **Essex Voluntary Blood Service** – or *Essex Bloodrunners* for short, is a charity providing medical courier services to the NHS and our two local Air Ambulances.

From the NHS Blood Bank at Basildon, our team of 80 unpaid volunteers deliver blood to A&E Hospitals in Essex and East London; samples for analysis, and supply blood to the Air Ambulances at Earls Colne and North Weald. Amongst many other tasks we also courier breast milk from donors to the Hearts Milk Bank and Ad-denbrooke's Hospital.

We made 10,000+ runs in 2022 and operate 24/7 x 365 which puts a heavy workload on our dedicated team. We need **more volunteers to share the load** – can you help?

Some seed fell on the path




and some on to rocks.

Some fell among thorn plants and




some fell on good soil.

Even as we re-open our church buildings, the lockdown and its aftermath has had a really detrimental effect on church income. The absence of collections and other donations means that we are currently losing out on about £200 per week. Additionally, most of our planned fund-raising events during the pandemic had to be cancelled, a loss from which we still have not yet recovered.

Even though worship things are not normal, most of the bills continue at the same rate as before. Our largest outgoing is the Parish Share which we pay to the diocese in order to pay the clergy, and we have had to significantly reduce our contribution to this. Next largest is the cost of insuring our two buildings.

BISHOP'S STORTFORD & DISTRICT TALKING NEWSPAPER



This article is a plea for help, and you may be able to provide it.

We are trying to recruit more listeners for our service. The Talking Newspaper is a weekly recording of local news taken from the Bishop's Stortford Independent and the Dunmow Broadcast. It is a free service, including postage and all necessary equipment, for anyone who is visually impaired or who cannot manage a newspaper because of

some physical disability. The recording comes on a USB stick and we normally provide listeners with a special player for the purpose.

The restrictions placed on all of us over the past two years have highlighted the problems of social isolation. We know from our existing listeners how much they have appreciated the Talking Newspaper in keeping them in touch with local news brought to them by local voices. We are sure that there are many others who would feel the same if they were aware of it. These same restrictions have, however, made it much more difficult for us to identify new listeners, so please give serious thought as to whether you know anyone who might benefit.

The Talking Newspaper is also available via a Listen Online facility on our website: www.bstalkingnewspaper.co.uk

The website option can be used by anyone, whether visually impaired or not. It is also possible to access the recordings via links such as Alexa or an app on your smartphone. If that appeals, please contact us and one of our technicians would be able to provide assistance if required.

Orchards and fruit-growing in the Hundred Parishes

One pleasurable autumn task is the harvesting of ripened fruits from trees in your own garden. For most of us, our cooking apple will be a Bramley's Seedling and the dessert apple an Essex-bred Discovery or a Cox's Orange Pippin. Originating from central Asia, apples are incredibly varied with at least 2,000 named varieties! There are 150 named varieties in the gardens at Audley End.

In the 19th century the skilled horticulturalists at the Rivers Nursery at Sawbridgeworth bred and propagated many varieties of fruit trees, including the prolific Czar plum and Conference pear, both of which are still available today. The Conference pear features in Great Chesterford's 21st-century community orchard.

For commercial reasons, the range available from modern plant nurse-

Tremendous Takashi tackles 448 mile cycle ride for Helen Rollason Cancer Charity!



Cyclist Takashi Ikeda, 30 from Chelmsford has completed an incredible challenge for the Helen Rollason Cancer Charity raising over £1,000!

Starting on 30th June 2022, Takashi cycled solo for eight days from Chelmsford, Essex all the way to Edinburgh; an astonishing grand total of 448 miles (720 km) to raise money for the local cancer charity.

Takashi explains; *"I cycled continuously for eight days so I didn't have time to rest and recover from fatigue! There was a moment I woke up in the morning and wanted to stay in bed longer, but I reminded myself the purpose of this challenge, which gave me a reason to get up and start a new day.*



I lost my mum in 2018 - she was cheerful, made people laugh and pulled people together, so my life without her is very difficult. She was like the sun in the solar system for me - imagine how humans, animals and plants could survive without the sun? That is how I felt.



Her loss made me realise that I'd like to contribute to this world and the wellbeing of people, by spreading the message to as many people as I can that illnesses such as cancer, diabetes or stroke can kill anyone you love. For illnesses, prevention, early detection and treatment is vital. It all requires awareness. This is the initiative that encouraged me to fundraise and raise awareness of Helen Rollason Cancer Charity by sharing my experience.

My father-in-law, Rick Thompson, already volunteered for the charity and I lost my Aunt due to cancer when I was a child so it was an easy decision to choose Helen Rollason Cancer Charity to support. I initially took part in their Ride for Helen cycling event in May this year. I enjoyed it so much it inspired me to go on a solo cycling trip to Edinburgh to raise more funds!

On 7th July 2022, I finished my solo cycling trip to Edinburgh; 448 miles with at least 28,589 feet/ 8,713 meters elevation gain, without any injury and accident thankfully. I stopped at Peterborough, Nottingham, Kirkburton, Ingleton, Penrith, Carlisle, Hawick and Edinburgh. There were so many highlights of this cycling challenge; the views from the top of the hills in the Yorkshire Dales are unforgettable! People even cheered me on from their houses, cars and the pavement as I was cycling up the hills. I felt a great sense of accomplishment, pleasure and contentment that I hadn't felt for a very long time."

Advice from Essex Police: Cycle Security

Cycle security is always an issue with thefts from a variety of locations including the town centre, residential areas, and educational establishments. Commonly bicycles are either not secured or not secured properly, and this makes it easy for thieves.

Where do they go? Number of places: - in a container abroad, to another part of the country, stored in premises or sold as either a cycle or cycle parts via the internet, or third parties.

By taking some appropriate precautions and using good quality security products, and using them well, should help you to keep your property safe. Use the best security you can afford. Don't secure a £2,000 bicycle with a £20 lock! As a guide look to spend 10-15% of the value of the item on its security. Look for a "Sold Secure" certified chain **and** padlock or "D – Lock" preferably gold rated but certainly not below silver. Consider what you chain it to whether at home or whilst out, is that secure? Is it well overlooked to provide good natural surveillance?

Make a note of the frame number, security mark the cycle, there are a number of different methods available such as www.bikeregister.com, or see Secured by Design accredited products. Take a photograph of the cycle and any areas of damage or marks of identification, and some insurance companies may require one with the owner in the picture with it.

At home remove that first attraction to the thief or burglar: 1) don't leave garage doors open for long periods showing your expensive cycle and other property, 2) consider a "Ground anchor" or "Shed shackle" within



your shed or garage to secure your cycle to, 3) look at your shed or garages security and ensure you have good locks and that the hinges are protected, 4) consider a shed alarm, 5) if your home is limited for space outside consider a cycle storage unit, they are smaller than a shed.

If you can its worth getting your children or grandchildren into good habits, keeping their bikes secure and not leaving them discarded on the front lawn or other, may save problems in the future.

Check with your insurance company to see what security standards they require for your insurance cover to be valid.



Lacking in Ambition

Stansted Airport recently trumpeted its ambition to achieve net zero emissions by 2050, in response to the Government's 'Jet Zero' strategy for tackling climate change.

However, the increasing frequency of extreme weather events we are now witnessing all across the world clearly shows that tackling climate change is not something that can wait until 2050.


Jet aircraft burn enormous quantities of aviation fuel (kerosene) making them amongst the fastest growing contributors to climate change. Stansted is said to be the largest single source of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions in the East of England. Our local airport therefore has a hugely important role to play in the battle against climate change.

Does Stansted really deserve to be congratulated on aiming for net zero emissions by 2050? That's another 28 years of CO₂ emissions from up to 274,000 flights a year adding every year to the pollution of our planet and exacerbating all of the problems associated with climate change.

The Climate Change Committee (CCC), the independent panel of experts which advises the Government on the action needed to tackle climate change, has recommended that there should be no airport expansion in the UK until such time as the aviation industry can at least demonstrate that it is on track to achieve net zero emissions by 2050.

The aviation industry 'promises' to dramatically increase its use of so-called 'sustainable aviation fuels' (SAFs), from plant-based sources. However, progress to date has been at a snail's pace and the industry has consistently fallen short of all its previous targets for the use of SAFs. Moreover, SAFs still do not actually solve the problem of aviation CO₂ emissions.

Unless we are to stop flying, the long-term solution will need to be electric or hydrogen-powered aircraft but the technology is still in its infancy and there is no realistic prospect of eliminating jet propelled aircraft by 2050. Aircraft have a service life of about 25 years and the current order books for new aircraft, stretching up to five years ahead, are all for conventional aircraft types. - *Stansted Airport Watch*




