## THE STAFF TEAM

The Church Commissioners for England has learned from research it commissioned that Queen Anne's Bounty, a predecessor fund of the Church Commissioners' endowment, had links with African chattel enslavement. In response to this discovery, the Church of England has agreed to pay one billion pounds in reparations.

The reaction to this decision has been overwhelmingly negative. What about the Church's role in the Abolitionist movement? What of the need to finance local ministry and mission? One journalist from *The Telegraph* wrote that the decision was made in a 'fit of woke frenzy'.

I think I understand the arguments against, so I was quite interested in discovering the reasons for. Everything I found on Google was negative, however, so I'm still somewhat in the dark.

Justin Welby has said that the Church's past involvement in the slave trade is a matter for sorrow, lament and repentance. In this, I think he is right.

Where the Church may have taken a wrong turn is in not engaging in sustained theological reflection about appropriate atonement. Perhaps I have missed something, but all I found from the Church was a web page which doesn't even scratch the surface of all the issues raised. As a result, I'm not sure what judgments were made to arrive at the figure of one billion pounds, or whether that sum factors in all aspects of the Church's historical response to the slave trade.

The problem, in other words, isn't that no atonement needs to be made, but that there hasn't been clear public discussion of how paying a billion pounds represents an acknowledgement of sin and an expression of repentance.
