

Hello from our staff team

I've just been listening to a fascinating reflection about the similarity between church and the theatre. The main argument in the reflection was that drama and church are both about creating space where there is encounter. The theatre creates a space where a story can be encountered from the viewpoints of different characters and so leads the audience to an encounter with truth. In church, the liturgy is the place where we create sacred space in which we hope to encounter the truth of God in Jesus Christ.

I'm sorry to say that I've never been a great theatre goer, and am shockingly ignorant of the work of our great playwriters. However, I have always been a

great fan of opera and have spent many an hour in opera houses all over the world. So, I can easily say that I love drama when it is mingled with music! One of the best experiences I have had in my opera going is to have twice attended a full performance of Wagner's Ring Cycle. The 'Ring' is four operas, each a development of the same drama. Each one is very long, the shortest is around 3 hours, the longest 5! They are performed on consecutive days, so going to the whole 'Ring' takes up most of your life for a week, but somehow that investment of time and total immersion in the music and drama makes for such a more intense experience and understanding of the music and drama.

This Sunday we begin the greatest week in the Church calendar- Holy Week. The services of this week are pure drama! Like 'The Ring' they are best experienced by making a commitment to attend all of them and to become totally immersed in the drama of the story of Christ's death and resurrection from the dramatic arrival in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the mystery of the Last Supper and into the agony of Good Friday, the quiet waiting of Holy Saturday and the explosive joy of the resurrection on Easter morning.

However, you spend your Holy Week and Easter may it be a blessed encounter with the truth of God's love for you made known in Christ Jesus.

DEANERY WALKS 2024

Together on the Way ... Sharing Stories

It is ten years since the first of our deanery pilgrimage walks in 2014 which began as we celebrated the 100th anniversary of the formation of the Chelmsford Diocese in 1914. In the first year we journeyed together, walking and talking, to all 28 churches in the deanery, and since then 8/9 churches each year as we moved to monthly walks.

Our theme this year is 'sharing stories', Jesus was the master storyteller as he walked with his disciples or spoke to the crowd round him. Over the last 10 years we have formed friendships and exchanged stories, we have listened to others tell us significant stories about the places we have walked, and we have shared stories about our churches, their history, memorials and the faithful communities who have worshipped there.

The symbol for this year's walks is the scallop shell one of the most iconic symbols of the Camino de Santiago. Together with a yellow arrow it is still used to guide pilgrims to Santiago de Compostela. It is said a pilgrimage is a journey to a significant place, made with the intention of encountering God. As we walk together may we encounter God in the landscape, in our companions and in the places we visit, and may our faith be inspired by the stories we share.

The calendar of walks is on the back of this leaflet, please note this year we will be **starting at the later time of 9.30am** at the designated church, we will walk for one hour before returning to the church at 10.30am for refreshments, finishing with worship together in a short service. Please join us and bring friends and dogs, all are welcome. There is a contact for each walk if you need more details. This year there will be a deanery service on Sunday 20th October to mark the end of our walks.

Following the walk we gather for a short service, including praise and thanksgiving, a Bible reading, intercessions and closing prayers.

Praise - a hymn, song, or the following canticle may be used.

Bless the Lord all you works of the Lord:
sing his praise and exalt him for ever.
Bless the Lord you heavens:
sing his praise and exalt him for ever.
Bless the Lord you angels of the Lord:
sing his praise and exalt him for ever.
Bless the Lord all people on earth:
sing his praise and exalt him for ever.
Bless the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit:
sing his praise and exalt him for ever.


Leaflets about Connect 120 are also now available, and will be put in the back of churches very soon. Do please distribute to anyone you think might be interested.
