## PRAYERS FOR THE KING

By the Rev. Colin Fairweather



I WRITE THESE WORDS a day after the news broke about King Charles having cancer.

As the established Church, we Anglicans pray for the monarch as a matter of course. There will, needless to say, be an added urgency to our prayers over the

coming weeks and months. I think the king has done a cracking job so far, assuming the role more seamlessly than many had expected: long may he reign over us.

Last night, a prayer was issued by the national church for the king. I found it on Twitter, posted by the Archbishop of York. This is what it says:

Father of mercies,
grant to Charles our King
comfort and sure confidence in you,
and keep him in perpetual peace and safety
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

At the risk of sounding disloyal to the Church I have given my life to, I'm not sure this is a brilliant prayer. No doubt it was composed in haste, but there isn't any reference to healing, which is surely the most important petition to the Almighty in this particular circumstance. I was left with the rather unnerving feeling that maybe the upper echelons of the Church of

England know more than we do – an impression compounded by the use of the word 'perpetual', which recalled for me the liturgy of the Requiem: 'Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them.'

Well I'm certainly still rooting for the king's recovery, and it turns out the Church of England already has a perfectly good prayer for his well-being. This from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer:

high and mighty, King of kings, Lord of lords, the only Ruler of princes, who dost from thy throne behold all the dwellers upon earth; most heartily we beseech thee with thy favour to behold our most gracious Sovereign Lord, *King Charles*; and so replenish him with the grace of Holy Spirit, that he may always incline to thy will, and walk in thy way: endue him plenteously with heavenly gifts;

strengthen him that he may vanquish and overcome all his enemies; and finally, after this life, he may attain everlasting joy and felicity;

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

grant him health and wealth long to live;

O Lord our heavenly Father,

Amen.

I know which version I prefer, and I've made it my Lent resolution to pray it every day. Perhaps you might join me?

#### "14 Years of Sharing the Easter Story"

THE IDEA FOR A REAL EASTER EGG began in 2008 when David Marshall, who founded Meaningful Chocolate, was given an Easter egg.

On the side of the box it read: 'Easter is the festival of chocolate and

loveliness'. He searched for an Easter egg which mentioned the Christian story of Easter.

It became clear that out of the 80 million eggs on sale there was not a single manufacturer who was willing to mention the religious aspects of the festival. So he asked churches and schools to help crowd fund The Meaningful Chocolate Company to manufacture the UK's first 'Real Easter Egg'.

For it to be a 'Real Easter Egg' it had to reflect the Easter themes of hope and new life and do three things – have a copy of the Easter story in the box, be made from Fairtrade chocolate and support charitable causes.

Twelve years on more than 1.8 million eggs have been sold with over 1.4 million sent through the post. The rest have been sold through retailers and supermarkets. Over £320,000 has been donated to charitable projects with Fairtrade Premium fees paid to farmers allowing them to buy everything from school books and solar panels to providing fresh water.

As such The Real Easter Egg campaign is one of the biggest evangelism initiatives in the UK. It crosses all denominations and offers a simple way to share the Easter Story.



#### **News for March 2024**

In February work progressed fast on the second half of the new path to make sure it was ready for visitors on snowdrop days, but unfortunately the good weather for pathbuilding also meant the snowdrops coming up fast and being rather ahead of themselves, making us nervous for our snowdrop days. So what March will bring is anyone's guess!

Daffodil season will probably start early, so why not consider a Group Visit for March? The Gardens don't open on Thursdays until April, so a Group Visit is the only way to see the daffodils in the Lime Wood at their best. Last year we welcomed the retired International Daffodil Registrar to the Gardens. She found many daffodils that resembled the 17 old varieties that she identified in her 2003 survey. They were probably planted at the time that Peto redesigned the Gardens for the Countess of Warwick. The main

catalogue available then supplied more than 400 varieties. Now Kew reckons that 36 wild varieties have been identified and there are over 26,000 cultivated varieties. So, open your eyes to daffodils this year! 

A plague in St Peter's Church, Ugley, recording the generosity of a benefactor


#### Benefactors of the Poor

We are fortunate today that we have a benefit system to help vulnerable people. In the past, the less fortunate relied on parish relief or the generosity of the better-off. Some wealthy benefactors left money for the provision of almshouses. Other philanthropists helped the poor by giving money in a variety of ways. Some churches record the benevolence of these donors on large "benefactor" boards. For example, in St. Peters, Ugley we are told on one board that Robert Bucke, a draper, in his will of 1620 gave 3 suits of clothes to 3 poor men and 3 suits to 3 poor women with hats, to be given every third year "for ever".

Benefactor's Plaque in St Mary the Virgin, Hatfield Broad Oak

Just a few miles away in Manuden's parish church, a board describes three benefactors, one of whom is the same Robert Bucke. Here he gives the same number of suits to the poor of Manuden, here with additional hats, shoes and stockings.

In Little Hadham the church of St. Cecilia has a board recording that Miss Ann Scott, in her 1865 will, left dividends to the rector and church wardens to distribute bread on Shrove Sunday each year "at their discretion" to the poor of the Parish.

Hatfield Broad Oak's Church of St. Mary the Virgin has a brass plaque describing the generosity of John Gobert. He left £600 in his will of 1623 for the purchase of land, the proceeds from which were to be distributed in a variety of ways including £4 per annum to the town of Hatfield Broad Oak. His heir Sir John Barrington subsequently bought the manor of Keeres in Aythorpe Roothing to comply with the will.

Please look out for more proclamations of generosity.



# STANSTED RETURNS TO BUSINESS AS USUAL

Figures released in January show that Stansted Airport handled just under 28 million passengers last year, only slightly below the number of passengers handled in 2018 and 2019, i.e. before the Covid-19 pandemic caused such

major disruption to air travel.



The severity of the impact of the pandemic upon air travel can be seen in the table above. Stansted passenger numbers slumped to 7.5 million in 2020 and just 7.1 million in 2021.

The speed of the recovery – just two years to return to prepandemic levels of

flying – has confounded most forecasters, especially since this coincides with a cost of living crisis.

And it's not just Stansted which has seen a fast recovery from the effects of the pandemic. Heathrow also is almost back to pre-pandemic passenger numbers and has just recorded its busiest ever December.

It's much the same picture worldwide. According to the International Air Transport Association (IATA), in November 2023, global demand for air travel reached 99% of 2019 (i.e. pre-pandemic) levels. It seems that neither economic challenges, nor concerns about global warming, are stopping people from flying.

Stansted Airport has however been taken by surprise by the speed of the recovery and now faces the prospect of severe overcrowding in the terminal over the next three years.

This is because the airport cancelled a planned increase in terminal capacity when the pandemic struck. Preliminary groundwork started for a new dedicated arrivals building in March 2019 but this was abandoned within a matter of weeks.

The airport has now decided to extend the existing terminal by adding three more bays to the rear of the terminal, rather than build a separate arrivals building. This is a major project and is expected to take until early 2027 to complete. It will also mean the removal of the airport transit trains system. This will be replaced by moving walkways.

If passenger numbers continue to increase, the existing Stansted terminal will struggle to cope, especially during the busy summer periods over the next three years.

From the standpoint of local residents adversely affected by aircraft noise, the key issue is not the number of passengers handled by the airport but the number of <u>flights</u>, which includes cargo flights as well as passenger flights. In this regard there is some good news.

Stansted handled 9,816 Cargo flights last year, considerably less than the pre-pandemic (2019) figure of 10,406. In fact, the number of cargo flights has been in slow decline for the past 20 years.

The vast majority of Stansted flights are, of course, passenger flights, and the vast majority of these (about 80%) are Ryanair flights. Stansted handled 168,715 passenger flights last year, more than 4,000 fewer than 2019, when passenger numbers were almost the same.

This obviously means more passengers per plane. On average, each flight carried 166 passengers at Stansted last year, the highest figure on record. The average number of passengers per flight has grown steadily, year on year, ever since the Wright brothers first took to the air in 1903! It will continue to increase steadily over the coming years.

Ryanair recently placed an order for 300 Boeing 737-MAX-10s at a staggering cost of US\$40 billion for delivery between 2027 and 2032. These aircraft are only slightly longer than the Boeing 737-800s currently operated by Ryanair but they have 21% more seats (228 seats compared to 189). The new aircraft are also claimed to be less noisy and to have lower carbon emissions than the 737-800s. We will need to wait until at least 2027 to find out for ourselves whether these claims are borne out.

Like it or not, Stansted has planning permission to handle up to 43 million passengers a year. If and when Stansted ever reaches that throughput, it would clearly be better, in terms of noise, air quality and carbon impacts, if this could be achieved with the fewest possible number of mid-size planes.

Quite how our local roads will manage to cope if and when Stansted Airport ever reaches a throughput of 43 million passengers a year is another matter!

Even as we re-open our church buildings, the lockdown and its aftermath has had a really detrimental effect on church income. The absence of collections and other donations means that we are currently losing out on about £200 per week. Additionally,

most of our planned fund-raising events during the pandemic had to be cancelled, a loss from which we still have not yet recovered.

Even though worship things are not normal, most of the bills continue at the same rate as before. Our largest outgoing is the Parish Share which we pay to the diocese in order to pay the clergy, and we have had to significantly reduce our contribution to this. Next largest is the cost of insuring our two buildings.


